Internship Diary Guidelines

A student's internship diary is a mandatory reporting document for their internship.

The internship diary must include logs of various types of work (literary/methodological/experimental/analytical/other types of work) completed by the student during the internship.

Logs are prepared for each day of internship. The logs must contain information on the date, topic(s) of the lesson(s), and the work performed during the individual assignment.

When recording work on individual assignments (IA), the following algorithm must be followed:

- 1. Describe the essence of the assignment (goals/objectives/implementation algorithm/methodology, etc.)
 - 2. Record the actual data it is advisable to present it in a tabular format.
- 3. It is necessary to reflect personal participation in the implementation of activities for the functional performance of junior and mid-level medical personnel, recording everything they did, observed, and participated in (i.e., indicate the types of work performed during working hours).
 - 4. Records must reflect the entire scope of work completed and be concise and clear.
 - 5. A summary of the findings/conclusions must be made based on the results of the assignment.

The internship diary must be signed:

- a) after each protocol by the student's internship supervisor.
- b) on the title page by the organization's (university's) internship supervisor.

Introductory Information for Students

The objectives of the internship are:

- to study the functional responsibilities and working conditions of a ward nurse in surgical departments;
- to acquire skills in communicating with surgical patients, their legal representatives, and medical personnel, and to implement the principles of medical ethics;
- to learn differentiated care techniques for the most common pathologies and provide pre-hospital care in emergency situations;
- to acquire and reinforce skills in promoting a healthy lifestyle;
- to acquire skills in completing basic medical documentation for the nursing station.

During the internship, the student should gain skills (experience):

- performing procedures to ensure the maintenance of personal hygiene in seriously ill patients (assistance with morning toileting, creating a comfortable position for the patient);
- performing procedures to ensure the maintenance of personal hygiene in seriously ill patients (cleaning the skin, mouth, and ears);
- Performing procedures to ensure personal hygiene in seriously ill patients (hair washing);
- Performing procedures to ensure personal hygiene in seriously ill patients (providing a bedpan, urine bag);
- Performing procedures to ensure personal hygiene in seriously ill patients (washing the external genitalia);
- Performing procedures to ensure personal hygiene in seriously ill patients (skin care, pressure ulcer prevention);
- Measuring the patient's body temperature (graphic recording on the temperature chart);
- - Feeding the seriously ill patient;
- - Counting respiratory movements;
- - Measuring blood pressure;
- Determining and counting the radial pulse:
- Preparing the patient for an ultrasound of the abdominal organs, retroperitoneal space, and bladder;
- - preparing the patient for EGD and gastric X-ray;
- - preparing the patient for colonoscopy and barium enema;
- - administering a cleansing enema;
- - shaving the surgical site;

- - placing a nasogastric tube;
- - bladder catheterization;
- - transporting the patient from the ward to the operating room;
- - positioning the patient on and off the operating table;
- - placing a gas vent tube;
- - filling and administering an ice pack;
- - monitoring and caring for drains and drainage systems;
- - monitoring and caring for stomas;
- - changing underwear and bed linen for a patient with limited mobility;
- - providing first aid in case of fainting and collapse;
- - providing first aid in case of hemoptysis and pulmonary hemorrhage;
- - providing first aid in case of vomiting;
- Providing first aid for external bleeding;
- Providing first aid for renal colic;
- Performing resuscitation (artificial ventilation);
- - Performing resuscitation (closed cardiac massage).
 - Upon completion of the internship, the student should have knowledge of:
- the organization of surgical care in the Russian Federation;
- - the structure and organization of a surgical hospital;
- - sanitary and hygienic requirements for the structural premises of surgical departments;
- the therapeutic and protective regime of a healthcare facility;
- - the functional responsibilities of a ward nurse in a surgical department;
- - the basic principles of medical ethics and deontology;
- - the concept of general and specialized care;
- the specifics of caring for patients with various surgical pathologies;
- - cardiopulmonary measures;
- algorithms for providing first aid for various conditions.
- the student should be able to:
- comply with occupational health and safety regulations, safety precautions, and sanitary and hygienic standards;
- measure height, weight, body temperature, blood pressure, pulse rate, and respiratory rate;
- - prepare the patient for laboratory and instrumental examinations,
- - surgery;
- - transport the patient;
- - provide general and specialized care for patients with various pathologies;
- - provide first aid;
- - perform resuscitation measures.
